In Memorium: Bennette Johnson Morris

Bennette Johnson Morris, one of the driving forces behind our Helena-West Helena therapeutic group home for girls, went to be with the Lord on July 17, 2020, while surrounded by her family at her home. Bennette was born in Little Rock, Arkansas, on December 1, 1929, to Parker Ewan Johnson, Sr. and Bennett Irene Johnson.

According to Emily Shields, therapeutic group home consultant for the home, Mrs. Morris was "one of the nicest, most giving people I have ever had the pleasure of knowing."

She moved to Clarendon, Arkansas, at age three. After graduating Clarendon High School, she attended Hendrix College for two years before transferring to Southern Methodist University where she graduated in 1951. She was a member of Zeta Tau Alpha. Upon graduation, she moved to Helena, Arkansas, where she worked with the Home Extension Office.

Bennette met her future husband, Walter Luther Morris of West Helena, Arkansas, in December of 1951 and they were married June 12, 1952. During 65 years of marriage she became a loving mother of four, Margaret Bennett Morris Sellers, husband Paul; Mary Virginia "Gina" Morris; Walter Luther Morris, Jr., wife Jayne McCain; Leonora Harriet Morris Maclay, husband Doug. The family tree grew with seven grandchildren, Callie Bennett Sellers Towles, husband Allen; Margaret Morris "Mollie" Sellers; Walter Luther Morris III, wife Elizabeth "Liz" Bernie; Mary McCain Morris Cole, husband Josh; Meredith Pointer Maclay McNeely, husband Justin; Claire Parkhill Maclay Auffenberg, husband Daniel; and Douglas Weller Maclay III. Then she became a greatgrandmother to seven great grandchildren Campbell William Towles, Caroline Bennett Towles, Lawson Allen Towles, Walter Luther Morris IV, Mae Louise Morris, Bennett Thomas Cole, and Genevieve Ann McNeely due this year. Bennette loved nothing more than spending time with her family. Sending daily scriptures or encouragement, gathering for family vacations at the beach, celebrating the holidays in their home, or celebrating milestones in each of their lives, she was a beautiful example of unconditional love.

Whether you knew her as Mom, Nanny B, Aunt Bennette, Bennette, Miss Bennette or Mrs. Morris you always felt welcomed, accepted and loved. She cared for people. Her greatest joy was found in giving to others whether it was helping the young girls of the Ophelia Polk Moore Home, the animals at the Humane Society of Phillips County, those searching to know the Lord through Bible Studies, or participating in every aspect of church life at Saint John's Episcopal Church. Bennette loved her community, her country and her Razorbacks. As her children grew up, Bennette was not one to sit on the sidelines. She was involved in every aspect of her children's lives. Through those years and beyond, she was blessed by the love and respect that was doted upon her by friends of all generations.

We also want to thank Scott Beardsley and his family for contributing school supplies, and everyone else who helped us acquire deodorant, body wash, toothbrushes, toothpaste, bed sheets, bath towels, paper towels and toilet tissue this summer.



Employee Giving Contributions Help Patients, Families, Each Other

The funds employees contribute from their check each pay period at Methodist Family Health help to purchase necessities, resources and services to benefit the Arkansas children and families in our care. Most recently, we used some of the funds to support employees infected with Covid-19 by providing some meals, bottled water - even helping one employee who was quarantined by purchasing and delivering a birthday cake for her child.

Some of the funds have been used to defray the costs of training conferences and workshops for employees. We also have purchased food and t-shirts for employee appreciation, materials for recreational therapy, and replaced items the kids in our care have lost or might have been destroyed in moving from placement to placement or through accidents.

In addition, the money employees contribute pays for special activities for clients, game systems and other needs that directly benefit the kids in care. A majority of funds spent at Methodist Behavioral Hospital provide hospital week celebrations including meals for staff, grab bag goodies and t-shirts, and Christmas celebrations. We have also continued to fund our garden, and we are purchasing weighted blankets with the funds, too!

Last year we raised \$43,000 from the Employee Giving Campaign. OUR EMPLOYEES made this possible, and on behalf of our team members, leadership, and the kids and families we all serve, thank you!



Methodist Family Health Receives Personal Protection Equipment Grants
