

If you are looking for innovation and a willingness to try almost anything new, you can find no better volunteers than Angie and Dylan Potts.

This year's co-chairs of Southern Silks, Angie and Dylan have navigated the sloppy track that COVID-19 has thrown them, and they are now riding to the finish line for Methodist Family Health's first-ever virtual fundraiser.

Dylan is a partner and shareholder with the law firm of Gill Ragon Owen, P. A., which serves as legal counsel for Methodist Family Health Foundation, the charitable foundation supporting Methodist Family Health. - \$1,050 grant from Rebsamen Fund for summer camp


Increase Your Income Now Leave a Legacy to Methodist Family Health
