Estella Blue, office manager of Methodist Family Health Day Treatment Program



Among her duties are arranging intake for prospective students, working as a liaison with the school districts, obtaining and securing all documentation for the students' records, ensuring day treatment students stay in compliance, scheduling students' visits with Methodist Family Health's psychiatrist, and, as she says, being what the children need when they need me.

Q: Tell us a little about yourself. Are you from Arkansas originally?

A: I moved to central Arkansas in late 2013 from Monroe, Louisiana. I don't have any family here, but I love the area and its breathtaking scenery.
