Giving Light Unto All in the House Recipients of Methodist Family Health Services Share Their Light with Others in Need

Have you ever experienced a dark night of the soul? A time when everything you knew and believed were no longer true. A time when you did not know if you could move forward. A time when you were in a spiritual crisis in your journey to know and love God.

As living beings, all of us will encounter a dark night of the soul. While we may not recognize it at the time, God's infinite love and mercy is shining on us, and if we follow that light, it will show us the way to a union with him.

Elizabeth Grobmyer and Annie Lankford are two people who reckoned with their own dark nights of the soul, and they have come into the light with the help of their God and the services of Methodist Family Health.

"I had been to so many other rehabs before that my family asked me what was different about Arkansas CARES," said Elizabeth.

The Arkansas Centers for Addictions Research, Education and Services is a 3-month treatment program for pregnant women or mothers with children 12 years old or younger provides a family-centered approach to decrease maternal substance abuse and promote healthy family outcomes through prevention, treatment education, research and advocacy.



"Arkansas CARES is known for being strict, and that's why we have such a success rate," Elizabeth said. "You can't talk your way out of anything here. If you want to get better and give your kids a better life than they are experiencing while you are on drugs, Arkansas CARES is the place to go."

Not only is Elizabeth a successful graduate of Arkansas CARES, she is now a case manager there.



"It changed my life, and I never thought of myself as anything but an addict," she said. "Because of Methodist Family Health, I am a mother, professional, head of household and so much more."

Like Elizabeth, Annie Lankford is a mom and professional, serving as associate pastor of First United Methodist Church in North Little Rock. She knew about Methodist Family Health through the United Methodist Church in Arkansas, but it wasn't until her own child needed intervention that she came to understand what our continuum of care does.

"I was at a complete loss when we needed help for my son's depression," she said. "The first place I reached out to was Methodist Family Health, and they stepped in immediately to care for my son, my family and me.

"I cannot explain how reassuring it is to have a place you can turn to that you know cares for your child as much as you do. As a mother, turning over the care of your child to anyone is almost impossible, but Methodist Family Health got him the help he needed, and I am forever grateful."



Face masks and paper goods were quickly in short supply. Arkansas's United Methodists and seamstresses came to our rescue by making homemade masks and dropping them off to be sanitized and distributed to our employees and those in our care. To encourage the children and families in our facilities at the time, supporters sent cards, letters and notes of reassurance to our children, families and staff.

To accomodate for the health, safety and well-being of our sponsors and supporters, the Methodist Family Health Foundation revised our fundraising







events - Bright Night and Southern Silks - and made them virtual instead. Both were successful, and we were able to create fun experiences while socially-distanced from guests, contributors, vendors and the community.

As the pandemic moved into the summer and fall, we knew we would have to provide a variety of personal protective equipment those employed by, being cared for and visiting our statewide facilities. We thank these organizations and individuals who have donated towards the purchase of this equipment for Methodist Family Health. To date, a total of \$178,492.50 has been received for PPE from grants and individual donors.






