#### Inspired by his work with his late wife, Lewese, Jon continues to help Methodist Family Health Children shine

Jon Ahrens and his wife Lewese had little idea of Methodist Family Health when they retired to Mount Ida, Arkansas, in the late 1990s. In fact, they belonged to the Episcopal Church in Hot Springs.

In spite of this, Jon said that each Sunday as they drove to church, they would pass the Joplin United Methodist Church. When they noticed that the parking lot was always full, and as they got to know people in their new neighborhood, Lewese was intrigued to try out the little church. They fell in love with the church, and quickly became active members.

During that time, the minister was highly involved with the mission of Methodist Family Health, encouraging the community to participate as well. As Jon recalls, they often took Methodist Family Health boys on outings, held barbecues, and had activities with the boys and their counselors.

"Being with the boys and their counselors was a wonderful time," says Jon. "Our membership has since aged, unfortunately." The Ahrens became engaged with Methodist Family Health Foundation after learning about it from Maggie Beeler, a former director of development. The experience had a significant impact on Jon and his family. In his view, the way donors are treated contributed to their learning and growing confidence in the Methodist Family Health Foundation.

"I'm sure that other agencies care," he says. "But they don't meet all of the needs. Methodist Family Health has a unique philosophy for caring for an individual as long as needed, and that spoke to us."

Items include:

#### **ITEMS IN MOST NEED**

For the health and safety of the Arkansas children and families in our care, we ask all items donated are new. The following items are in most demand all year long by our patients and clients throughout the state:

- WHITE towels and washcloths
- WHITE and twin-size-only sheets, mattress pads, comforter sets, and pillowcases
- Bed Pillows
- Body wash (male, female or unisex Suave only)
- Non-aerosol spray or solid deodorant Suave only (male, female or unisex)
- Shampoo Suave only
- Conditioner Suave only
- Lotions (unscented) Suave only
- Toothpaste regular and sample sizes
- Toothbrushes (both adult and child sizes)

- Paper towels
- Tampons
- Diapers in sizes 5 and 6
- Undershirts in men sizes small to 4X
- Boxer briefs for men all sizes
- NON-SPIRAL composition notebooks

#### Bath


- Shaving cream

Captain, companion and friend to Mr. Ahrens. Throughout and after Mrs. Lewese's passing, Captain has remained close by Mr. Ahrens.

When Lewese had trouble breathing and her heart and lungs were not functioning properly in April of 2019, Jon's life was turned upside down. The Ahrens discovered that Lewese had a malignant tumor behind her lungs. It was determined by doctors and specialists there was no recourse. The family brought Lewese home, and she died peacefully with hospice care. Mrs. Lewese Ahrens did not live a full week once the tumor was found.

Jon continued to serve others. In his opinion, a man's biggest responsibility is to his wife. After Lewese died, he used any funds they had for her future to benefit others, including Methodist Family Health Foundation. Having a strong belief in supporting local causes and nonprofits, Jon gives to several organizations within his "own backyard." He volunteers freely as well, serving on the board of the local food pantry since 2007.

Asked what he would say to a new donor interested in Methodist Family Health Foundation, Jon responded:

"From my standpoint, I would emphasize how many kids are helped by encompassing care. Not short term. Methodist Family Health starts at a young age and goes to the adult threshold. We are helping young people become responsible, healthy and right-minded people."

Our gratitude goes out to Mr. Jon Ahrens and to the late Mrs. Lewese Ahrens for the impact they have made on so many lives.

#### We Have Grown!

In 2019, Methodist Family Health Foundation launched a capital campaign to raise \$4,256,175 to construct the Mike Millar Spiritual Life Center. With funds pledged and secured, ground was broken in October 2021.

This new multipurpose spiritual life center is named in honor of Mike Millar, a devout United Methodist, noted attorney in Searcy, and a long-time board chair, board member, donor and supporter of Methodist Family Health. The center includes a chapel, multipurpose space, a welcome center and office space for all Methodist Children's Home administrators. In addition, the new center includes an outdoor labyrinth for prayer and meditation, new landscaping and a parking lot.

The building is 5,118 square feet and was completed in the fall of 2022.
